HEALTHY MOMS & BABIES IN BRITSTOWN

Entrepreneurs and micro businesses are getting enterprise development support from a custom-designed Mobile Business Unit, funded De Aar Solar Power.

Community members attended the Think Twice workshop in Britstown, where they expressed their appreciation for awareness of the dangers around the use and abuse of alcohol, and especially during pregnancy.

This is one of the first steps in the launch of FARR's Healthy Mother Healthy Baby programme, which is being run in the remote town of Britstown, to provide pregnant, community women with information, and the necessary skills to make informed decisions regarding the health of both themselves and their unborn babies.

De Aar Solar Farm's funding also supports the FARR awareness programmes, which provide additional training to educators, social workers, health professionals and students.


